Re: Case 11-T-0116 - Application of Long Island Power Authority for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need Pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law to Increase the Design Capacity of the Existing 10.6 Mile Wildwood to Riverhead Electric Transmission Line from 69kV to 138 kV

Dear Secretary Phillips:

On behalf of PSEG Long Island LLC on Behalf of and as Agent for the Long Island Lighting Company d/b/a LIPA, a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Long Island Power Authority ("PSEG Long Island"), enclosed for filing is: (i) a revised set of Environmental Features and Drawings showing the location of identified invasive species, locations of invasive species cleaning stations, and a list of invasive species to be encountered during construction; and (ii) an updated set of drawings pertaining to line terminal work.

Pursuant to Ordering Clause 2 of the July 3, 2014 *Order Approving the Environmental Management and Construction Plan to Increase the Design Capacity of the Existing Wildwood to Riverhead Electric Transmission Line* of the Public Service Commission in the above-captioned proceeding, PSEG Long Island was required to conduct a survey for invasive species 3 to 9 months before the start of construction of the project. While these surveys were conducted in the required timeframe, these attached documents have been updated to reflect more current conditions:

- Invasive Plant Management Plan (dated September 20, 2019, Revised October 14, 2020); and
- Threatened and Endangered (T&E) Plant Species Field Inspection Report (dated September 12, 2019, Revised October 14, 2020).

Additionally, in recognition that some time has passed since the Environmental Management and Construction Plan was originally approved, an updated set of drawings pertaining to the line terminal work, incorporating current construction standards, is also enclosed.

This updated documentation will also be posted on the Project's website (www.wildwood2riverhead.com).

PSEG Long Island, having completed most construction activities located in the right-of-way, will commence construction activities related to the line terminal work for the above-captioned project on or shortly after January 11, 2021.
